What happened to the former chat whereby C.E.T. designation is supposed to be enhanced to C.P. Was it carried out or no?	Marcelo B. Jr. Villanueva	At the Special Meeting of Members on September 16, 2025, OACETT members voted in favour of changing the title of the C.E.T. designation to Professional Technologist or P.Tech, on the condition that it is approved by all the provincial members of Technology Professionals Canada, resulting in a common national title.
Is there any update on when the name change will occur?	Dan Timpano	As was shared during the meeting, the name change timing is now awaiting the decision of the other provincial organizations with respect to the use of Professional Technologist. The timing of the OACETT name change is linked to the change of the title of the designation, as they will be done together to achieve marketing efficiencies.
